**Museum Dome (Figge Conservatory)**

**Louise Nevelson's Dawn's Forest** – Made up of multiple sculptural pieces, *Dawn's Forest* is Nevelson's largest and most complex sculptural environment, and her last major work.

**1st-floor Galleries**

**Louise Nevelson** – through Sunday, May 20

This insightful exhibition features a remarkable variety of works from throughout Nevelson's prolific career, ranging from massive wall pieces to more intimate wood sculptures. *Generously underwritten by Bob and Terry Edwards.*

**2nd-floor Galleries**

**Modern Mexican Masters** – Permanent Collection. This new installation, drawn from the largest Mexican art collection in the Southeast, includes works by such masters as David Alfaro Siqueiros, Miguel Covarrubias and José Clemente Orozco. *Including works from the Pollak and the Bryna collections.*

**Leaders in American Modernism** – Permanent Collection. These paintings and drawings, many of which are from the Ahmet Ertegun Collection, represent all of the important movements in American art during the first half of the 20th century. Artists in the collection include Marsden Hartley, Oscar Bluemner, Arthur Dove, Jackson Pollock and many others. *Featuring selected works made possible by William J. & Suzanne V. von Liebig.*

**The Mouse House: Works from the Olga Hirshhorn Collection** – *The Mouse House* is a treasure trove of intimate-sized artworks from some of the giants of 20th century art – among them Picasso, Giacometti, Calder, de Kooning, O'Keeffe, Dubuffet and many others.

**3rd-floor Galleries**

**Ship to Shore** – This exciting exhibition features paintings, drawings, prints, photographs, sculptures and scale models exploring a wide range of oceanic and nautical themes, including artist Wayne Kusy's nationally acclaimed *Titanic* (1985), a 10-foot-long model constructed of 75,000 toothpicks.

**Juan Genovés – A Retrospective**

One of Spain's best-known contemporary artists, Juan Genovés is celebrated for his provocative expressionist paintings, which explore issues of social and political realism. His recent work has dealt with a theme of "the crowd" while investigating visual rhythms and static movement in painting. Genovés' work can be seen in leading museums around the world.

**Dale Chihuly's Persian Ceiling** – made up of over 600 individual pieces, measuring 49' 8" long by 5' 9" wide. *Generously donated by Patty and Jay Baker.*

**Philharmonic Galleries**

**Fourth Annual Student Exhibition** – through Sunday, May 27

This exhibition features more than 300 works by Collier County public and private school students, grades K-12. A diverse array of mediums, including painting, drawing, sculpture, ceramics and photography, are showcased. *This exhibition is organized by the Naples Museum of Art.*

**Masters of Miniature – The Kuppjack Rooms and Kaye Collection**

Some of the world's most exquisite miniatures will be on display this season as part of the museum's *Masters of Miniature* exhibition. Featured works in this wide-ranging collection of miniature rooms include the majestic *Roman Triclinium*, the *Napoleonic Anteroom* and the *Louis XV Petit Salon*.
